The Parameter Fair is dedicated to presenting and selling works that imaginatively engage (re)generative methods and explore alternative modes of artistic production, the use of material resources and interfacing with a world in a state of multiple crises.

It aims to showcase and support transformative practices and aesthetics that challenge recommender systems, art markets and project-based production while emphasising care, accessibility, adaptability and resilience.

In its third edition, the fair features ten artists whose practices entangle new and traditional techniques, combine manual and mechanical processes, experiment across digital and analogue realms, and build upon the principles of open source, creative coding and permacomputing.

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ARCHE-SCRIPTURES: THE MATERIAL MEMORY OF A BORDER (2024)

Arche-Scriptures revolves around understanding ceramics as a possible medium to store digital information. The Material Memory of a Border series, created as a sitespecific research at the former customs post of Carinarnica on the border between Slovenia and Italy, reflects on the transience and permanence of borders as information systems, exploring the paradox between the permanence of ceramics and the fragility of digital memory.*******

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T A G E B A U H A M B A C H (2025)

Tagebau Hambach is a 1:2500 scale topographical atlas of an open-pit lignite mine. Each millimetre on the page and each contour line represents a 2.5 metre cubic section of the earth, as it was the moment the sensing laser hit the hillside. More seascape than landscape, seven giant excavators continually remove material, which is separated, dumped, burned. The fly ash is placed on ships or pumped into salt mines. The unstable soil shudders, slumps, leaks. The atlas records a moment in this process.

FRANCIS NOWAK's (1990, UK) work is an attempt to understand madness at scale: how innocuous, internally rational ideas and mechanical processes build up into burning mountains, yawning crevasses and social paroxysms. Wandering from a broader theoretical engagement ("What is a machine?"), his archaeologically-inspired practice explores subjectivity and the phenomenal world conjured by being "inside" the machine.

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Shedding Light is an analogue print on photosensitive paper of a video sequence captured in Gaza on 2 November 2023. On this date, the Hajji Tower, housing the last camera installed by AFP, was struck by an attack aimed at destroying the livestreaming viewpoint. Ironically, the camera recorded the attack itself. Despite this, investigations continued through witness documentation and OSINT investigations. Created in collaboration with Forbidden Stories, an organisation continuing the work of silenced journalists.****

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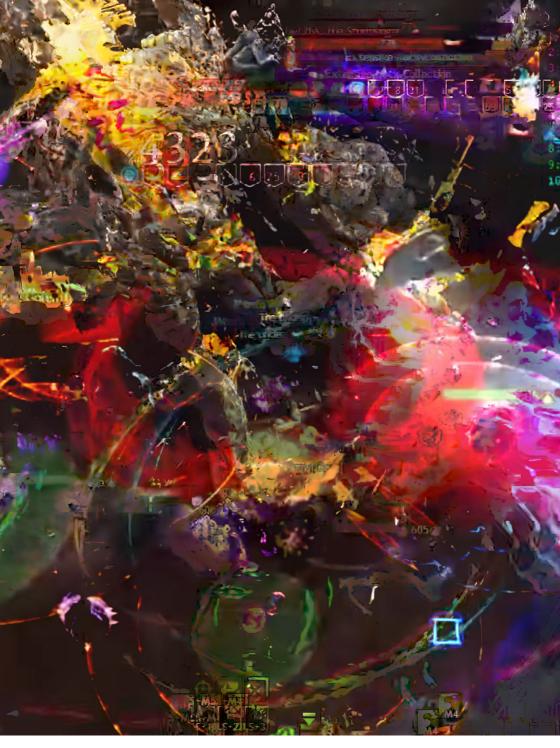
POINT OF RESPAWN (2023-ONGOING)

In the series, the artist mashes, chops and repurposes ready-made visuals that were created with an average fantasy game consumer in mind. In a subversive - neurodivergent and transgender - act of layering, remixing and glitching, the artist creates ecstatic and dizzying images depicting amalgamations of players with no clear delineations. Considering cybernetic warlocks as the last hacker warriors opposing the superstructure, the imagery becomes almost symbolic of how users themselves can often break society's imposed narratives.********

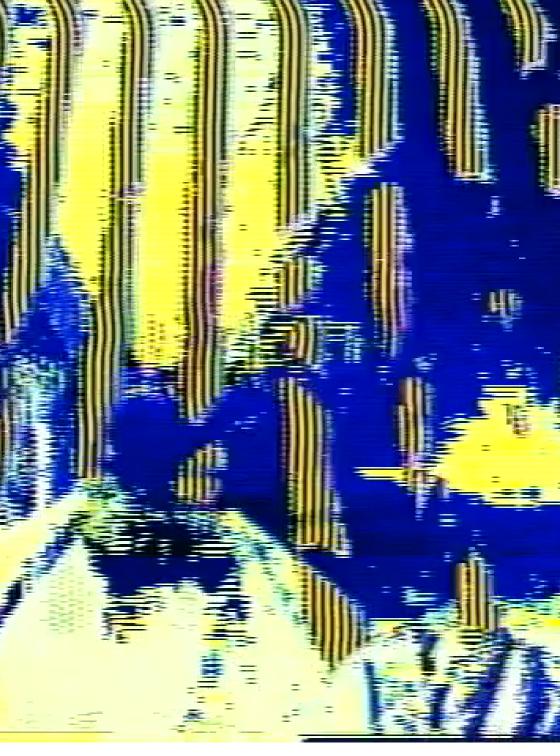

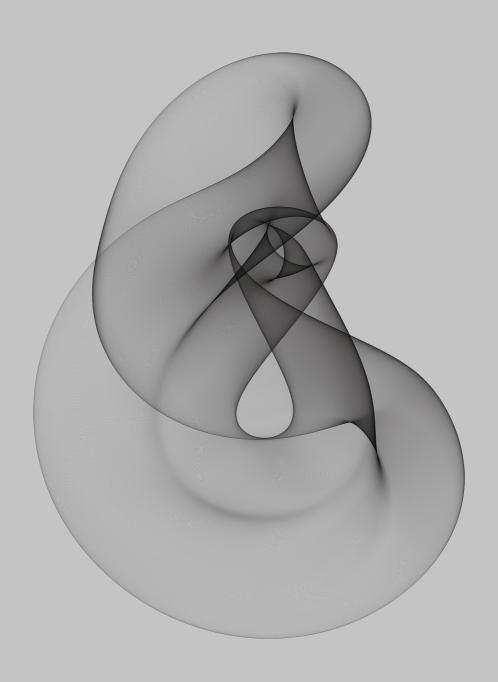
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Each work in the series originates from an underlying geometry generated from a set of functions that can generate numerous geometries that follow the same logic. Every form is further refined through the adjustment of pixel values, resulting in many colour variations of the same geometry. Throughout the process, Stell Pičman explores the possibilities of space, texture and colour by tweaking the generation parameters, utilising moiré patterns for texture and playing with colour channels.*****

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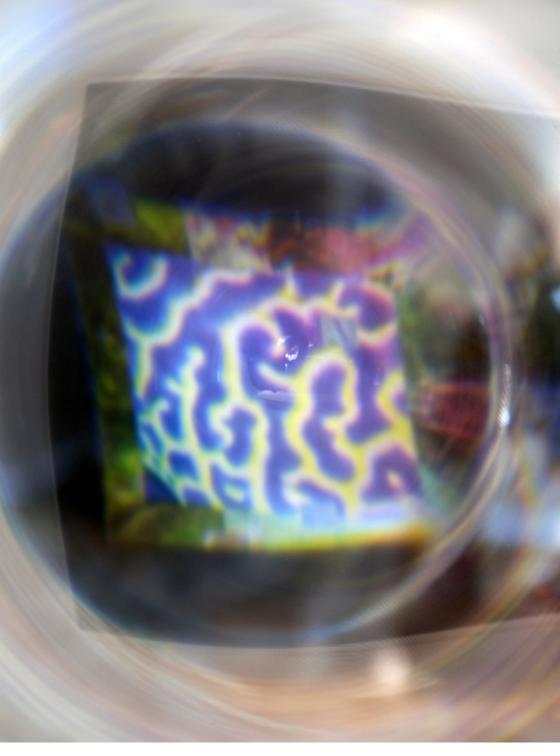
A STRUCTURAL PLAN FOR IMITATION: ENGINES OF DIFFERENTIATION, ITERATIONS (2024)
